JOB TITLE: Sport Science and Sports Medicine Lead

REPORTS TO: Associate Director, Sports Science & Sports Medicine

SALARY: £55,000 to £63,000 per annum (dependent on experience)

SUMMARY:

Work closely with, and support, the Associate Director, Sports Science and Sports Medicine (ADSSSM), as part of the cross-aquatic Sports Science and Sports Medicine (SSSM) leadership team, to develop and implement a SSSM strategy to positively impact on performance and Individual Athlete Plans. The role will have a particular focus on an identified discipline(s) (consisting of Diving, Para-Swimming and Swimming), while actively contributing across the aquatic disciplines through aligned work on targeted strategic projects, groups and 'themes'.

JOB PURPOSE:

- Support the development and implementation of the British Swimming (BS) cross aquatic SSSM strategy with a particular focus on an identified discipline(s)
- Support and lead on identified projects and strategic priorities across the aquatic disciplines of Diving, Para-Swimming and Swimming
- Provide strategic leadership to one of the SSSM 'theme' areas

JOB LOCATION:

- The normal place of work will be one of the BS Performance Centres (London, Leeds, Loughborough, Bath and Manchester)
- A presence at other BS Performance Centres will be required and hence frequent travel throughout the UK and internationally will be required

In conjunction with the ADSSSM, support the delivery of an appropriately aligned BS SSSM strategy





- Coordinate and manage identified members of the SSSM team and ensure that SSSM is positively impacting on performance and Individual Athlete Plans
- Ensure SSSM services are embedded and aligned to coaching programmes and in the wider activity of the WCP to enable maximum impact on performance and culture
- Develop and maintain strong relationships with the relevant sport specific leadership team(s) bringing insight, knowledge and challenge to the WCP by sitting on identified leadership teams
- Make a significant contribution in the process of evolving understanding of future performance requirements across the aquatics, including the scoping and delivery of research and innovation projects
- Manage the delivery of an aligned Individual Athlete Planning (IAP) process across all aquatic disciplines.
- Contribute to the design and construction of the strategic plan across all disciplines
- Manage the implementation of designated strategic objectives and projects across all disciplines
- Support the management of the SSSM budget to maximise the impact of science and medicine services in performance centres and at competition
- Support the production of concise and relevant performance data and information to inform decision-making and reporting
- Support national team activity in competition environments as and when appropriate
