Rules and Formats

Age groups

Under 11 Boys (Year 5/6)

Under 11 Girls (Year 5/6)

Under 13 Boys (Year 7/8)

Under 16 Boys (Year 9/10/11)

Under 13 Girls (Year 7/8)

Under 16 Girls (Year 9/10/11)

Under 19 Boys (Y12/13 - Straight to County final on EOI)

Under 19 Girls (Y12/13 - Straight to County final on EOI)

Format

- Teams will consist of 4 players of the same gender (except under 19 girls, which is 2 players)
- All players in a team must be in the appropriate age category at start of September 2022 and study at the same school
- LSTTA has full control over the County finals and has authority to adjust all elements of the Finals if necessary. Local rounds must be coordinated between schools and the SGO.
- All team matches should be determined by the number of individual matches within each team match won or drawn allowing 2 points for a win and 1 for a draw.

County Finals

- At County finals there will be 2 groups drawn on the day, splitting the competing number of teams equally in half or as near as possible to equal. I.E. 10 teams would produce 2 pools of 5 teams. This will form the Group Stage of the competition.
- In the Group Stage of the County finals, fixtures will be played as one individual match for each of the 4 players in the team, equating to 4 individual matches in total which will make up the 'team match'.
- The resulting group standings will be used to draw the fixtures for the Finals Stage, based on the order that the teams finished in the Group Stage. The winner of Group A will play the Winner of Group B for the title. The runner up of Group A and B will play off, and so on.

- For the Finals Stage of the competition the format with change to a best of 3 or 5 games, with each of the 4 individual team members playing twice, equating to 8 individual matches to make up the overall 'team match'.
- The designated format for which player plays whom within the team matches will be followed. E.g: 1 v 1 and 1 v 2 etc.

Rules

- An individual match consists of an uneven number of games.
 'Uneven' can be as few as one and up to 5. The length of each match may be determined by time and table constraint
- Each player must serve twice consecutively before service transfers to the opposition
- A game is won by the player first scoring 11 points, with a clear gap lead of 2 points; if both players score 10 points, then the game is won when one player has a lead of 2 clear points (E.g. 13-11)
- A coin toss will determine serve, with the winner serving first in the first game; after 2 points, the receiver becomes the server and so on after each 2 points until the end of the game. If 10-10 is reached, the service is alternate
- For the second game, the initial receiver serves first and in subsequent games, it alternates
- A good service starts with the ball resting on the palm of the hand with the ball thrown upwards about 6 inches (16cm); the server hits the ball from behind the end of the table so it bounces on his side of the table and then on the other side
- A good return is made when the receiver hits the ball over the net on to the other side of the table
- A point finishes when the ball is hit by the player so that it does not bounce on the other side of the table – I.E: it goes off the table or into the net
- A 'let' service is when the server serves the ball and it touches the net and hits the other side; the service is repeated until good.
- A 'let' will be called by the umpire if a ball comes into the playing area from an adjoining table
- The bat will have red on one side and black on other
- Equipment required: table tennis tables, bats, balls. Schools MUST provide their own bats. At county finals stages balls will be provided by the Association
- Members of school staff may be asked to umpire matches
